Aegis News

Throughout 2016, Aegis Trust's successful model for **peace education** in Rwanda has been giving **tens of thousands of young people** the tools to overcome the legacy of fear and suspicions left by the 1994 genocide, to break the long term cycle of violence and **build reconciliation, trust and cooperation for a brighter future.**



With Aegis' **Rwanda Peace Education Programme** now incorporated into Rwanda's National Curriculum, Aegis, in partnership with the Rwanda Education Board have trained **over 100 teacher trainers** on the delivery of **Peace and Values Education in classrooms**. The teachers will now go back and pass on to their colleagues the skills required to implement this for children at all levels of education.

Jean Pierre Rutagengwa, a chemistry teacher from Gatsibo District, was among those who took part. **"I learnt a lot from the history that led to genocide and especially from the testimonies of courageous people like a young girl who saved a baby during the genocide,"** he said. **"This is a story I can tell to any of my students, and believe can build empathy in them."**



Aegis trains young Rwandans on storytelling for peace building

A recent initiative has involved workshops at the Kigali Genocide Memorial in Rwanda, gathering young people across the country to learn how to promote **peace in their communities** through film and photography.

Participants were taught to create stories that promote **positive values** and contribute to **building a more peaceful society.**

Gerard Hatangimana, 25, from Gicumbi District, said: **"This programme is guaranteed to succeed. Lessons are easily grasped when they are delivered in a visual way. They make an impression and not easily forgotten."** Aegis Trust Youth Coordinator, Marc Gwamaka, led the training and said the outcomes of the workshop will **leave an impact on Rwandan society.**
